Honoring Whānau Upholding Reo Māori

Te Wāhanga, NZCER, invites you to a half day wānanga focusing on critical issues in Māori education. This gathering follows on from wānanga we organised in March and September 2012. This wānanga is for whānau including Māori educators and practitioners.

This wānanga will offer diverse whānau an opportunity to contribute and explore our current kaupapa Māori research, Whānau Mai Te Reo: Honoring Whānau, Upholding Reo Māori. This kaupapa aims to support whānau reo development and decision-making during transitions between kōhanga reo, early childhood services, kura kaupapa Māori, primary, wharekura, secondary and beyond.

We invite you and your whānau to attend this half day wānanga at Tapu Te Ranga Marae to hear a brief presentation on what we have learnt so far in Whānau Mai Te Reo. It is an opportunity to continue to wānanga about the critical issues for whānau, which inform our research priorities on this project.

Moana Jackson will share reflections on this research project and the kōrero of the wānanga.
