# Who are we?

Psychological Test Services (PTS) supply and provide advice on a wide range of psychometric tests. Tests are available for purchase from a number of well respected international test publishers. In addition to the range listed on our website, we can source other tests for specific needs. If we don't have what you are looking for please contact us. We may be able to source it for you, or advise where to go next.

### **Registration Levels**

When registering with us users are given a registration level based on their qualifications and experience. People are registered with PTS under the work area(s) most relevant to their scope of practice. There are two work areas: **Psychology and Education**. Within each work area there are three ascending levels of registration: **A**, **B**, **and C**. Each level includes the ones below it, e.g. a person at Level C is also a Level A and Level B within their work area.

To purchase a product you must be registered in its work area at its required level. For example, the ASEBA School Age forms are rated as Level B (Psychology/Education). To purchase these you must be at a Level B or higher within either the Psychology or Education work areas.

### How do I register?

To register with PTS you need to visit our website: www.nzcer.org.nz/pts/

We recommend having copies of your qualifications and academic transcripts ready before doing this.

- Log into the website by clicking the Log in/Sign up button on the top right corner of the page. If you do not have a login on the website click the Sign up tab to the left of the log in and enter the required details.
- Once you are logged in head to the **Psychological Test Services** page by clicking the link in the menu bar. Click the **Register Online** button.
- Enter your relevant details into the form. Required fields are marked with a red asterisk\*. You can upload copies of your qualifications and transcripts near the bottom of the form. These are important to ensure we give you the most accurate registration level possible.
  - ightarrow Once you are ready to submit the form, click the **Register** button at the bottom of the page.

We will get back to you within 5 working days to let you know if your application has been successful or if further information is required.

# **Registration Levels**

### Level A

Applicants must provide supporting documentation to demonstrate adequate knowledge of test administration and scoring, as well as knowledge in their area of practice.

Types of assessments available to Level A test users include:

- Standardised Tests of Achievement
- Diagnostic Tests of Achievement
- Standardised group tests of academic aptitude

This level includes registered teachers.

#### Level B

Test users at this level are expected to have a basic understanding of psychometric theory, as well as specialised knowledge in their area of practice.

Applicants need to have completed a Bachelor's degree in a field related to the area of test usage as well as a basic course in psychometric test administration and interpretation, such as a second or third year tertiary paper.

Types of assessments available to Level B test users include:

- Abilities tests
- Behaviour checklists

Examples of users at this level include:

- Speech Language Therapists
- Occupational Therapists.

### Level C

Test users at this level are expected to have a broad base of knowledge and skills in the use of tests, with successful completion of a practical assessment of test use.

Applicants must provide supporting documentation demonstrating competence to administer and interpret tests across a wide range of conditions within their area of practice. Successful applicants under this level will have completed a Bachelor's degree and a postgraduate qualification in their field of speciality and **must** have completed an advanced course in psychometric assessment as well as an advanced course in personality/abnormal theory.

Types of assessments available to Level C test users include:

- Personality assessments
- Tests of general ability

Examples of users at this level include:

- Clinical Psychologists
- Educational Psychologists
- Organisational Psychologists.

Registered **clinical psychologists** automatically meet the requirements for Level C (Psychology) and only have to submit a copy of their APC for approval.

## **Professional obligations**

NZCER supplies tests only to an appropriately qualified person on the understanding that:

- Every precaution should be taken to ensure the confidentiality of tests and test scores.
- Access to test materials must be limited to qualified persons with a responsible, professional interest who agree to safeguard their use.
- Test users are asked to report the unauthorised use of tests and urged to protect the value of tests by keeping all components securely stored so they will not become available to unauthorised persons.
- NZCER's interpretation of the Privacy Act 1993 is that candidates are entitled to know, if they so request, all

scores relating to their personal test performances. Our strong recommendation is that the release of test scores should be accompanied by sufficient interpretive detail to enable the client to understand the scores provided.

- Registered Test Users are expected to purchase and use tests according to the following guidelines:
  - The Code of Ethics for Psychologists Working in Aotearoa New Zealand 2002
  - Guidelines on the use of Psychometric Tests, prepared by the New Zealand Psychologists Board
  - Te Tiriti o Waitangi.
- Approval to purchase may be withheld or withdrawn if there is any violation of these principles.
